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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES **FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2018**

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The principal activities of the association continue to be:

(1) The provision of opportunities for families and interested individuals to give mutual support, informal advice, information and guidance in order to advance the wellbeing of families with children of any age who are on the autism spectrum and who live in the London Borough of Lewisham.

(2) The provision or the commissioning of facilities, services and activities for the benefit of the family members.

Significant activities

During the year SIGNAL Family Support Limited carried on its usual activities providing mutual support for its members via various activities. These included family trips to places such as Broadstairs beach, Diggerland in Kent and the Science Museum, plus our annual trips to see the pantomime at Greenwich Theatre and ten-pin bowling at Surrey Quays. We also held monthly evening meetings for parents covering various topics from online safety to employment and thriving with ASD. Our speakers included adults on the autism spectrum and an advisor from the NSPCC. Regular coffee mornings enabled families to meet up in an informal environment. We also held a special coffee morning in February which brought together representatives of various local agencies and was a great opportunity for our members to pick the brains of

Our children's weekly trampolining sessions and ASD swimming classes continued to be popular and well-attended. During August we held a watersports day for families at the Docklands Watersports Centre which was so successful that the Centre instituted a series of regular sessions for young people with disabilities and a number of SIGNAL families have attended regularly. Our annual Family Summer Party in July was another successful event, as was our Family Picnic and Games Afternoon, held during August in a local park with the help of team of young people from the NCS.

A new addition to our regular activities is our Teens' Group which is a weekly meet up for teenagers on the autism spectrum. This has proved very popular with our young people who wish to socialise but need that little bit of support and a safe environment. We have also been active in campaigning for better SEN services in the borough. Meanwhile, our newsletters, email bulletins and active Facebook group continue to keep our members informed about SIGNAL's activities and other autism-related news and events throughout Lewisham and the surrounding areas.

Volunteers

We would like to thank our volunteers who have generously donated their time and talents to SIGNAL Family Support Limited.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

A big thank you to BBC Children in Need, Baily Thomas, London Community Fund, Merchant Taylors and Children First Lewisham. We would like to thank them for their continued support of our activities.

Our fundraiser was particularly successful during 2017/18 and secured an exceptional amount of funding which will be used over the coming year or two. It is not anticipated that our income will be maintained at this level and we have not received any grant income, or notice of any, since the end of that financial year.

Reserves policy

The charity has a formal reserves policy such that reserves are maintained a level to cover 3 months' operating costs. As at 31 March 2018 this was approximately £15k.

FUTURE PLANS

Looking ahead, we are hoping to maintain our current levels of activities whilst aiming for new projects within the constraints of finding funding in financially straitened times. We are currently considering expanding our young peoples social group to include another one for younger children, and working with other local groups to provide practical workshops for parents/carers around topics such as travel training, applying for EHC plans and how to communicate effectively with schools.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2018

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Computer equipment

- 25% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
